- "He married Miss Sedley five days ago" Dobbin replied. "I was his groomsman" (Thackeray, *Vanity Fair, 2001*:262)
- "The old clerk shook his head. Dobbin begged Chopper to report progress to him at the hotel where he was stopping, and walked off moodily westwards, greatly perturbed as to the past and the future." (Thackeray, *Vanity Fair, 2001*:262)
- "The town was quite quiet when she woke up at ten o'clock, and partook of coffee, very requisite and comforting after the exhaustion and grief of the morning's occurrences." (Thackeray, *Vanity Fair, 2001:*339)
- "O mother, mother!" cried poor Amelia in reply. "You told me nothing-I-I promised him the books. I-I only sold my shawl this morning... And she went into her room, and sank down in despair and utter misery. She saw it all now. Her selfishness was sacrificing the boy" (Thackeray, *Vanity Fair, 2001*:542)
- "At his new home master George ruled like a lord: at dinner he invited the ladies to drink wine with the utmost coolness, and took off his champagne in a way which charmed his old grandfather." (Thackeray, *Vanity Fair, 2001*:656)
